

WORDLESS BOOKS-

When you read wordless books with your child:

- You allow them to tell their own stories in a logical order.
- You show them how books "work" without relying on words to tell the story.

Introduce the book by reading the title and the author, then:

- Ask your child to tell you what the book might be about by looking at the picture on the cover.
- Give your child time to "read" the book on his or her own.
- Ask your child to "read" the book to you.
- Create your own wordless book with your child by drawing pictures and telling a story.
